Focus Teams

The Committee identified four initial focus areas for the planning effort. Each of these will be addressed through a Focus Team lead by a Committee member. Additional Focus Teams may be identified as the planning process progresses.

- 1. **Financial & Capital Investment Priorities**: This team will consider revenue sources including fundraising, grants, dispatch program and priorities for capital investments.

- 2. **Service Priorities**: This team will consider service level priorities across SFPD services, including medical, structure fires, wildland fires, vehicle crashes, and all-hazard. This will include setting service level goals, objectives and tracking. The team will consider ISO ratings and tradeoffs.

- 3. Organization Structure & Staffing Priorities:. This team will consider staffing options including training, certifications, paid employees, dispatch program, and merging with other districts. It will also look at the need for non-responder volunteers, such as an administrator or quarter master. The team will talk to neighboring districts about direction they are going for information on local trends and opportunities.
