- 1. Bike Races. SFPD as well as LHFPD continue to work closely with BC Transportation regarding special event permitting process. We will now receive weekly updates on races. Once they are fine tuned either Henry or myself will send out notification emails to residents whenever a permitted race is going through our district. Knowing about races in our neighboring districts is also crucial as it will affect mutual/auto aid response times to our district.
- 2. Fire danger is high and the fire weather outlook suggests that it will stay at least the same but likely move to "extreme" before too long. SFPD at this point is not considering sending engines out for dispatch. This may change if conditions improve significantly.
